NH MCAP ECHO: ADHD and Trauma

Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and trauma are two pediatric concerns that share common symptomology and often comorbidities, but different etiologies and treatments. This ECHO series will focus on assessing, treating, and providing home and school supports for children with either or both of these conditions in addition to other comorbidities.

NH MCAP will:

- Increase knowledge and confidence in treating children and teens with trauma and/or ADHD
- Create a network of faculty experts and peers to provide case-based feedback
- Provide individual provider to provider teleconsults from ECHO faculty
- Offer CME/CNE and SW CEU credit for attending ECHO sessions

Project ECHO: Moving Knowledge, Not Patients



Through video conferencing, Project ECHO connects providers across the state with faculty experts to discuss cases, provide peer and expert feedback, as well as brief trainings using an all teach all learn model.

Participants will:

- Present one case within the 10-month cohort
- Engage with questions and recommendations during each session

Sessions will begin in February 2021 and will be held monthly through November 2021.
