Strategic Intents 2016-2020

Promote awareness of and interest in pediatric care quality measurement, projects, and resources.

Facilitate dialogue to identify and act upon pediatric care quality opportunities in NH.

Conduct and/or collaborate on pediatric quality improvement projects.



Recent Efforts

Developmental Screening Learning Collaborative

Practices increased screening rates for one year olds from 0 to 70%.

Second cohort of clinics begins November 1, 2016.

Oral Health

Assessment of current NH oral health preventive services delivered by primary care clinicians serving children < 6 years, as well as the barriers and facilitators optimizing their delivery.

Neurology Telehealth

Coordinated a project to support 4 rural NH clinics in piloting telehealth visits for pediatric patients with epilepsy.

HPV Immunization Learning Collaborative

Recruited NH practices to participate in two National Immunization Partnership with the Academic Pediatric Association quality improvement collaboratives to increase HPV immunizations.

ADHD

Survey assessment of NH pediatric clinician practice patterns, comfort level, and support to treat pediatric patients with ADHD and other co-occurring disorders
